

How Hezbollah Sacrifices Christians for Propaganda Wins

THE LIE

Hezbollah protects Lebanon's Christians, while Israel bombs their churches.

THE TRUTH

Hezbollah exploits Lebanese Christians both politically and militarily, using them as props in their war against Israel.

BACKGROUND

- On April 10, 2026, Tucker Carlson amplified journalist Steve Sweeney's assertion that Hezbollah protects Christians and churches in Lebanon, and that it is Israel that targets them. ([Tucker Carlson](#))
- Tucker has made this accusation himself, charging that Israel deliberately targets Christians and then fabricates pretexts about terrorism to justify the strikes. ([Tucker Carlson](#))
- On May 1, 2026, former congresswoman Marjorie Taylor Greene accused the IDF of destroying a monastery in the Lebanese border village of Yaroun. The claim was false. The Israeli government published evidence showing the monastery still standing. ([ITN](#))

TRUTH EXPLAINED

- On May 19, 2026, IDF Major (res.) Itamar Sapir, 27, was killed in southern Lebanon after a Hezbollah terrorist sniper shot at Israeli soldiers from inside a church. ([Jerusalem Post](#))
- In March 2026, Hezbollah seized the Christian village of Qawzah and converted it into a rocket and anti-tank missile launch base targeting Israel. In a second nearby village, they established operations beneath a church. In El-Khiam, a Hezbollah military tunnel was found running directly under a church. ([Jerusalem Post](#)), ([Times of Israel](#))
- This is Hezbollah's playbook, documented on video for decades: fire rockets at Israeli civilians from Christian farms and villages, then watch Israel strike back at those same locations — and call it a massacre of Christians. ([CBN News](#))
- When the 2020 Beirut Port explosion devastated predominantly Christian neighborhoods, Hezbollah blocked the investigation. After October 7, 2023, Hezbollah declared support for Hamas and positioned rocket launchers in a Christian village near the Israeli border, putting that community directly in the crossfire. ([Providence](#))
- The strategy, also used by Hamas, is deliberate and effective: attack Israel from Christian villages and churches, and when Israel strikes back, accuse Israel of targeting Christians. Hezbollah wins either way — and Western amplifiers like Tucker Carlson make it work.
- Lebanese President Joseph Aoun, a Maronite Christian, blames Hezbollah for endangering Lebanon and has asked Israel to help disarm it. The leader of Lebanon's Christians calls Hezbollah an existential threat to his people. Tucker Carlson, broadcasting from Florida, knows better. ([Jerusalem Post](#))
- Hezbollah's founding 1985 manifesto explicitly calls for Sharia governance in Lebanon — a direct assault on the constitutional order that reserves the Lebanese presidency for a Maronite Christian. Hezbollah was not founded to protect Christians. It was founded to dismantle the political system that gives Christians power. ([Providence](#))
- The Lebanese Forces, the main Christian political movement in Lebanon, have revived their civil war rallying cry against Hezbollah: "Danger is knocking on the doors." ([Providence](#))
